Patient presentation: A 41 year-old woman known case of Hodgkin lymphoma that 12 years ago chemotherapy, RT and BMT were done for her
From 1 year ago she presented with left breast mass

Sonography and Mammography: multiple masses at 2-3 o'clock and left axillary LAP

CNB: IDC, Grade: 3, ER: positive, HER-2: positive, Ki67:25-30%

Bone scan: osteoblastic lesions at L1/L2/T12/sacral ala

MRI: increase uptake at L1/L4/T12
