1401/03: Right Excision, Benign phyllodes tumor, 27 mm, margin 5 mm, C-kit: positive, P63: positive, Ki67 2%, SMMHC: positive.

1402/05: Right recurrence excisional surgery: Benign phyllodes tumor 140*120 mm.

1402/09: Right 3rd recurrence incisional biopsy: Malignant phyllodes tumor

1402/10: Right Radical Mastectomy, deep pectoral resection, ALND, wide skin resection

Pathology: Malignant phyllodes tumor, 140mm, deep margin Pectoralis muscle involved in medial side, peripheral skin: free, LN 0/13, Ki67:40%.

Question:

Does she need Chest wall resection or adjuvant therapy?

Recommended plan:

1- Review of pathology is in favor of sarcoma, so chest wall resection is beneficial.
