Patient's Name: S.R

Patient presentation: A 68-year-old woman with positive familial history of breast cancer in her aunt presented with left breast mass at 2 o'clock, 36mm, mid zone and bilateral Axillary Lymphadenopathy.

CNB: Left breast, IDC, Luminal B, Ki67:45%, Lymph nodes: positive (bilateral).

There were suspicious microcalcifications at retroareolar of right breast (BIRADS: 4c). Marker placed inside the left tumor and right microcalcification.

She received chemotherapy which resulted in nearly complete clinical and pathologic response.

Question:

What is the proper surgical management for right breast?

Recommended plan:

- Bilateral breast cancer, Skin Sparing Mastectomy (SSM) and DTI.
