Patient presentation: A 66-year-old lady with history of BCT and radiotherapy 18 years ago, referred to clinic due to multiple purple skin lesion on her previously treated breast. Skin biopsy showed atypical vascular lesion. Review of the slides showed acquired tufted angioma (angioblastoma of nokoyawa) /atypical vascular proliferation, reactive angiomatosis or well differentiated angiosarcoma are in differential diagnosis.

Question:

What is the next treatment plan?

Recommended plan:

- 1- Total mastectomy
- 2- C-myc has helped in cases of angiosarcoma, but it is not necessary to check it in this case.
