Patient's Name: AM

Responsible Physician: Dr. Miri

Patient presentation: A 47 Y/O F with mass in her left breast

US:

Lt breast: A 20*25 mm mass in 12 o'clock (4b)

MG:

Irregular mass in left retro-areolar + thickening in skin

CNB:

IDCII/LVI-/ER: 60%/PR: 60%/Her2: -/ki67%: 20%

Axillary FNA:

Positive

She received NAC and was paralyzed, so she was investigated because of that

Cervical MRI:

Central disc protrusion C5/C6

Thoracic MRI:

Normal

Lumbosacral MRI:

Left foraminal disc L4/L5 & L5/S1

Neurologist consult was done:

Paralysis wasn't related to neurologic defect

PET SCAN:

4 nodules in RUL, highly suspicious for being metastatic



Question:

What is the best plan?

Recommended plan:

PET SCAN was reviewed:

Lung lesions suggestive for metastases or infection

So pulmonary consult and lung biopsy was advised for her
